



Waiting List Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Can I apply in person?

A. There will be no paper applications available, but if you do not have access to the internet or need additional assistance you can come to OHA or a partner site for assistance. All partner sites will be listed on our web-site

Q. Is there an alternative to submitting the application on-line?

A. Applications are being accepted exclusively on-line

Q. How long will it be until I am housed?

A. There are several factors that affect how long it will take until you are housed.

- Selection from the waiting list can be between (1) month to (2) years depending on your waiting list position.
- Once selected from the waiting list it can take up to (6) months until you are housed, to facilitate the intake and lease-up processes.

The length of time for intake depends primarily on ensuring all documents are provided at the intake appointment. Additionally, the time for lease-up depends on the time it takes an applicant to locate a unit.

Q. When will I find out what position I am on the waiting list?

A. Within (30) days of the waiting list close you will be notified of your waiting list position by U.S. mail

Q. What can I do if I need housing right now?

A. You can call 211 to find resources in the community that provide emergency housing

Q. If I am found eligible, can I use my voucher somewhere else?

A. Vouchers must be used in OHA's jurisdiction (Marion county) for at least (1) year, except in the cases of a reasonable accommodation

Q. I am disabled and, due to my disability, I need a change in policy/procedure to apply for the Housing Choice Voucher Program. What do I do?
